Separation of property: all property and income acquired by each spouse before and during marriage, remain their separate property. Upon dissolution, each spouse retains ownership of their respective property.


Partial community of property: all property and income acquired before marriage remain the separate property of the acquiring spouse. Property acquired during marriage - except for gifts and inheritances - is considered joint property of the couple, including: assets, income; and/or the accrued value of either. Upon dissolution, each spouse retains ownership of their pre-marital, while property acquired during marriage is divided between them.

Full community of property: all property and income, whether brought into the marriage or acquired during the marriage, become the joint property of the couple. Upon dissolution, all property - except for gifts and inheritance- is divided between the spouses.

Deferred full or partial community of property: property and income acquired before and during marriage remain the separate property of the acquiring spouse. Upon dissolution, the rules of partial or full community of property apply, and all property - except for gifts and inheritance- is divided between them.
